Jeanie Ruth (Hood) Bahlman, 76, died August 12, 2024 in Winters, Texas. Jeanie was born on September 7, 1947 in Pierre, South Dakota to Velma (Mann) and R.O. "Chaney" Hood. The family settled in Winters a few years later, where Jeanie grew up and graduated high school in 1966. Some of her fondest memories were being a twirler and part of "The Pride of West Texas" band. It was there that she met her high school sweetheart and husband of 52 years, Charles Bahlman. They married on September 9, 1966 and after Charles graduated from UT Austin in 1969, they started a family. They lived in San Antonio and Houston before moving back to their hometown in 1983. They owned and operated Bahlman Chevrolet for 27 years until Charles retired in 2010. Jeanie found a love for antiques and collectibles and spent several decades in that business. She handled estate sales, had booths at the Antique Gallery in Abilene, and held legendary yard sales that were known to attract a wide variety of memorable shoppers.

Jeanie was a Christian first and foremost. She and Charles were devoted to their church family. Jeanie loved to read and discuss the Bible, prepare Wednesday meals for 100+ kids, and minister to her community. And she LOVED to sing.

Survivors include one son, Chris and wife Melisa of Winters; two daughters: Cara Bradshaw and husband Casey of Canyon, and Jaime Bahlman of Lamesa; six grandchildren: Christa Green and husband Austen, Maddie

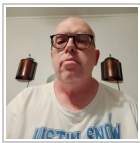

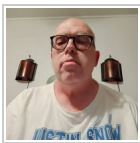

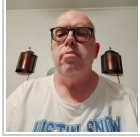
