John Edward Chew, a proud Vietnam War veteran and beloved husband, father, grandfather, uncle and friend, passed away peacefully with his wife and brother by his side on August 24, 2024, at the age of 76.

John (Johnny) was born on June 8, 1948, in Blackwell, Texas to Leroy and Virda Chew. From an early age, he displayed a strong sense of duty and commitment, traits that led him to enlist in the United States Navy in 1967. Serving with honor in Vietnam, Johnny earned several commendations for his bravery, including the National Defense Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal and the Combat Action Ribbon.

Johnny embraced life with passion and enthusiasm. He was dedicated to his work as a commercial refrigeration mechanic, a career he cherished until his retirement. Known as a jack of all trades, Johnny had a knack for tinkering and fixing, always ready to lend a hand to family and friends. Although you may have heard him boast about whoopin' someone's can, his greatest joy, however, was his family. He always greeted his mother and sisters with a kiss while other family members would no doubt, get a tight hug.
