Linda Jean Owen Mitchell, age 77, passed away Sunday, January 18, 2026. Linda was born on September 22, 1948, in Bryan, Texas, to Charles and Martha Owen. Linda grew up in Orange, Texas and graduated from Luther Stark High School in 1967. She attended Hardin Simmons University and later the University of North Texas, where she graduated in 1973 with a degree in Interior Design.
